

"I have mice in my house?" I gasped in surprise. So I let him in and became friends.




Reader's Cafe

Make-it challenge

Tea Light Snowman Ornaments



This is the Take & Make Craft for Teens for December! Pick up the supplies starting December 1 at the Ingersoll & Tillsonburg branches while they last!

Supplies needed:

- 2 battery-operated tealights
- 2 pom poms
- 1 piece of pipe cleaner
- 1 piece of square black felt
- 1 piece of red ribbon
- 2 pieces of glitter ribbon
- 2 pieces of elastic ribbon
- Glue gun
- Black Sharpie/permanent marker

Snowman #1

- Use the Sharpie to make your snowman's eyes and mouth.
- Cut a piece of red pipe cleaner and curve it around the tea light. Then add a small line of hot glue on both ends to hold it in place. Don't glue it the entire way around because you'll need to be able to slide the elastic ribbon under the pipe cleaner later.
- Add a dab of hot glue where the ears would be and add the pom poms. Now your snowman has ear muffs!
- Cut out a piece of red ribbon to be approximately 4.5" long. Then cross it over and add a small dab of hot glue to hold it together; this is the snowman's scarf.
- Add a small line of glue to the back of the scarf, then glue it to the back of the tea light. You may need a small dab at the front of the scarf as well, depending on how the ribbon lays.
- Slide a piece of the elastic ribbon underneath the pipe cleaner piece of the ear muffs and tie together so it can be used to hang the ornament.

Snowman #2

- Use the Sharpie to make your snowman's eyes and mouth.
- Cut a top hat out of felt.
- Add a small strip of glitter ribbon to the middle of the top hat as decoration.
- Glue the top hat to the top front of the snowman's face.
- Tie the elastic ribbon together so it can be used to hang the ornament.
- Glue the elastic ribbon to the top part of the snowman's head (behind the hat).
- Ta-da! You now have two tealight snowman ornaments!
